In 2000, student numbers at Geraldton Grammar School were around 190; the School now boasts in excess of 670 students. Under Mrs Shaw's stewardship the school experienced steady growth in terms of numbers of students as well as the introduction of many new initiatives and programs. Some of these include –

- three year olds education program,
- a dedicated middle school,
- a secondary Performing Arts program,
- Round Square,
- Outward Bound and Duke of Edinburgh programs,
- the introduction of both Indonesian and Mandarin languages across the school,
- significant building programs,
- expansion and change within the academic program in the secondary school.

The Board of Governors is deeply indebted to Mrs Shaw for her outstanding achievements during her thirteen and half year tenure at Geraldton Grammar School. Mrs Shaw made a significant contribution indeed to the excellent reputation enjoyed by our school as well as to its continued development and growth. The Board has been truly privileged to work with such a dedicated leader and proud to acknowledge Mrs Shaw's dedication to Geraldton Grammar School over this extensive period as an important part of the history of this wonderful school.

Parents and Friends

2013 has been a successful, fun and busy year for the Geraldton Grammar School P&F.

We would like to thank the parents, school staff and especially the GGS P&F committee members for their tireless work to plan and to run many wonderful activities throughout the year.

The P&F helps coordinate raising funds to benefit all students from K-12. It requires many volunteers and the more we have the less work each individual has to do. Every little bit of help we can get is immensely appreciated.

This year's events included the 100's Club, Adidas School Fun Run and the magnificent Art Exhibition. We also have some community based partners supporting our school such as Queens Supa IGA, student banking, parent donations which have, together with the main fundraising events and some very generous local business donations, resulted in a very successful year for the P&F.

These funds have been spent or set aside to pay for: natural playground, Inspire, edible gardens, tents for middle school, student kitchen, 3 Phase power upgrade and cooking equipment, drum kit and ongoing Speech Night awards. There were also additional payments towards the bottom oval upgrade and the hall sound system which were paid for early this year. A summary of the funds allocations follows:

\$19,825 for bottom oval upgrade

\$5,775 hall sound system equipment

\$11,530 natural playground / Inspire garden / edible garden

\$1,450 food tech room power upgrade

\$1,800 equipment for food tech room

\$2,498 drum kit

\$7,930 tents for middle school camps

Total - \$50,808 distributed or allocated.

From this it can be seen that a fair emphasis has been placed on all round enhancement for the whole school. It is vitally important for all parents to realise that the P&F is for all students and where possible we will try and make sure that everyone gets to experience the generosity that is part of the GGS P&F.

We have organised event procedures to help our projects run more smoothly. This means less work for more reward. Our P&F Facebook page, revamped P&F noticeboard (located at the pre-primary entrance called Geraldton Fisherman's Co-op entrance), email communications and a regular P&F update in the school newsletter are some of the ways we hope to help keep you in touch with your school and your P&F.

The 2013 committee members are a highly dedicated group of parents who are interested in helping to improve the school environment for our children –

and your children too! Many thanks go to Martyn Edwards (Vice President), Rebecca Goodwin-Parry (Secretary), Brendon Davies (Treasurer), Natalie Wheatley, Trish Palmonari, Tanya Kitto, Adam Semple, Deb Clarke and Garrie Blay. We hope to see you again in 2014 as well as any additional new faces who may be keen to help.

Involvement in the P&F is challenging, worthwhile and it is a great opportunity to network with the school staff as well as other parents. In 2014 I encourage all of you to become involved in some way no matter how big or small.

I hope we see you at a GGS P&F meeting soon and I look forward to 2014 being another successful year at Geraldton Grammar School.

These skype interactions enabled students to practise speaking and listening in the target language and form dialogue to exchange information with students of similar language ability.

A dance group consisting of year 2 and 3 girls performed a traditional Indonesian dance as part of the festivities. On display were many pieces of artworks and language work samples to represent some of the cross cultural learning that is incorporated within the curriculum at Geraldton Grammar School.

Independence Day celebrations were a highlight giving primary students an opportunity to appreciate the significance of the day, as well as experiencing some traditional food and fun activities. Students came to school dressed in red and white or traditional Indonesian clothing and participated in a formal flag raising ceremony with the singing of the national anthem before participating in a variety of traditional games and activities similar to events celebrated by their peers in Indonesia. It was great to see students working together and stepping outside their personal comfort zones.

Throughout the year students have been challenged to embrace and demonstrate their understanding of the schools INSPIRE program. The Seven Habits are integrated throughout the Indonesian Language Program with a particular focus on the importance of having empathy for others. By developing an ability to see situations from different perspectives students are better equipped to dispel some of the stereotypes that exist between different cultures.

During term 3, I was on study leave to complete an intensive language program in Jogyakarta, Indonesia. I had the opportunity to travel to different islands of the Indonesian archipelago and be immersed in the local culture. It was an amazing learning journey. Thank you to Mrs Barras who facilitated the language program for the term. The tour also included a visit to our BRIDGE school, Menanggal 601, in Surabaya, Java. It was great to see student work from GGS on display and used as resources for language learning in Indonesia by Indonesian primary students.

Once a week, students from junior kindy through to year 6 are taken on a musical journey that involves listening, moving, singing and playing. This means students are learning through music, not just about it.

Percussion is a strong component of the primary Music program. All students learn to play non-tuned percussion instruments including bells, shakers, tambourines and claves. Students from pre-primary up have had experience playing tuned percussion instruments such as xylophones and metallophones. From year 4, students are eligible to join our percussion ensemble, which this year was even recruited to accompany our choir for the first time.
