Secondary Camps Week

Year 7 Camp - Nukara

The Year 7 camp began Monday morning with a trip to the Chapman Valley Fishing farm. Here amongst the howling wind and heavy showers the students caught fish and learnt about hydroponics and aquaponics as part of the work on sustainability.

Tuesday morning the clouds were lifting and the camp to Nukara began.



Fun, cold, and tiring are some of the words the Year 7s used to describe their time at Nukara. Some were use to the outdoors so sleeping in a tent posed no difficulty but for others, they were pushed right out of their comfort zones. With all the recent rain, Nukara was beautiful. The creeks were full, the wildflowers were out and the sun shone. Nukara is a perfect example of sustainability and the students experienced first-hand the ecofriendly environment. They saw how stone, wood and tin could be re-purposed to make furniture and buildings. They drank the rain water, ate fresh food from the orchard, had the opportunity to use the bucket showers and had great fun playing on the recycled tyres and re-purposed wood offcuts that has been made into an amazing adventure playground. They climbed trees, sat around the camp fire and just enjoyed the nature around them. The students made damper, sailed model rafts, learned to make macramé and caught marron with simple nets. They were treated to homemade pizza and a movie night. The Year 7s were visited by our current Year 12s who came out to spend Wednesday morning on camp. Together they walked over the farmland and visited the Chapman Valley Museum. One of the activities on the final morning was community service, clearing the fallen trees to make bonfires.

It was a great camp. Thank you to the staff who helped run and organise the camp and the students who participated so positively.





Year 8 Camp - Lynton Station


