Thank goodness we were able to have the senior formal before the COVID-19 restrictions.































































The National Day Against Bullying and Violence

Secondary Rowing


With the recent purchase of some rowing machines by the Secondary PE department, the Year 9 and Year 10 students started a landbased rowing program in sport.







