Science & Engineering Challenge








On Friday 28 April, 30 Year 9 students attended the MidWest Science and Engineering Challenge. This is a day of STEM-based challenges where students work in small groups to complete activities such as making a glider plane from scratch which can hit a target, building a light but strong bridge which can support a heavy moving weight, make an earthquake-proof tower from straws and paper, and making a Mars-rover which can traverse a very uneven surface. There were also puzzle style challenges where students had to use mathematical networks to design transport routes, make up coding systems to communicate information, design electricity infrastructure for a city and plan and schedule complex events efficiently.

The day aims to encourage students to consider STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) subjects and careers and to use the associated skills such as creativity, critical thinking, communication and problem solving. Our students performed excellently with some groups winning their challenges overall. All students also displayed the school values of Respect, Responsibility, Perseverance and Inclusivity at all times and were great ambassadors for our school. A huge thank you also to our fabulous parent volunteers who attended and helped on the day.
















Kindy Mother's Day Afternoon Tea

Australian Track & Field Championships

In the April school holidays, Ella, Christi and Nicole travelled to Brisbane to compete in the Australian Track & Field Championships.

Ella competed against 10 others in the U18 Heptathlon (Day 1 Thursday: 100m Hurdles 1st, High Jump 1.67m PB 1st, Shot Put 10th, 200m 10th. Day 2 Friday: Long Jump 5.06m 4th, Javelin 6th, 800m 9th). She scored numerous points for the hurdles and high jump, and secured enough points in the other events to win a silver medal! On Sunday Ella competed in the U18 High Jump and jumped 1.64cm to secure 7th place. A fantastic Nationals campaign.

Christi and Nicole competed in the U17 2000m Steeplechase on Saturday afternoon with 20 of the nation's best on the start line. Christi ran faster and navigated the steeples better than she ever has before and crossed the line 0.54 of a second behind the second place athlete to claim the bronze medal in a 4 second PB time of 7:07.39. She has never been so ecstatic!

Nicole finished 18th in a time of 7:55.06, thoroughly enjoying the experience of her first Nationals Athletics event.









SSWA All Schools 2023 State Cross Country Championships









In May, Christi Bestry and Nicole Chamberlain travelled to Perth to compete in the SSWA All Schools 2023 State Cross Country Championships.

This event is the platform for selection into the SSWA State Cross Country Team. It was held at UWA Sports Park, McGilivray Oval, Mt Claremont on Thursday 18-05-2023 at 9.45am. This event attracts about 1800 competitors from Year 7 to Year 12's each year.

Christi and Nicole competed in the Girls 16 years 4000m race. Their results were outstanding and a magnificent reward for effort after their dedication and commitment in training, to being the best they can be. Out of 110 competitors Christi claimed the SILVER MEDAL in a time of 15:10 mins and Nicole placed 5th in a time of 16:17 mins.

Well done girls, the school community are super proud of you and wish you all the best at the Australian Cross Country Championships in Canberra in August.

Chloe Taylor (2013) - Patents New Chemical Molecule



Former student, Chloe Taylor, spoke with upper secondary students recently about her educational journey and recent completion of her PhD in Chemistry. Chloe was a Geraldton Grammar School Lifer (a student at the school from 3-year old Kindy through to Year 12) and she graduated in 2013. After school she moved to the University of Tasmania to study Marine and Antarctic Studies. Chloe told the students about how this led her to specialise in Chemistry and graduated with a double degree in Marine Studies and Chemistry.

During her undergraduate degree she participated in a research study with one of her lecturers and she strongly encouraged the students to take up these opportunities. This led her to complete an Honours year and then undertake her PhD during which she has designed, manufactured and tested a brand new chemical molecule which changes colour in the presence of a highly toxic, yet prevalent chemical, PFAS. She has now patented this technology and is looking towards further study. Her journey and story was very inspiring and insightful for the students, encouraging them to follow their passions and interests, to work hard and take the opportunities available to them. We are very proud of Chloe and it was great to hear another fantastic Geraldton Grammar School student success story. We thank Chloe for visiting the school and giving up her time.
