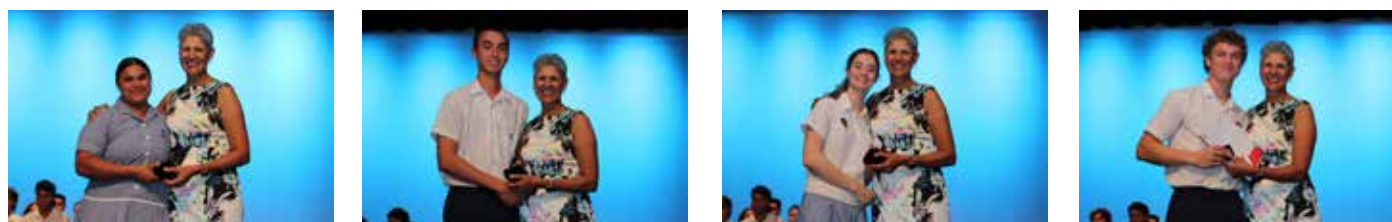
This award is given to a student who has demonstrated outstanding musical achievement in the skill development of their instrument, commitment to the program and school representation.

# Girls+ Engineering Tomorrow Forum



In Week 7, a small group of Year 9 girls attended Curtin University for the Girls+ Engineering Tomorrow Forum. After making the trip to Perth on a very hot day in a bus with no air conditioning we were very pleased to find our accommodation had a pool. The next morning we made our way to Curtin University in Bentley where we joined groups of girls from several other schools to find out about engineering as a study and career pathway.

Our group participated in 2 hands-on workshops. The first was run by engineers from the Water Corporation who explained about the various applications of engineering in distributing and treating water. In this activity we had a go at using design principles to purify a sample of "wastewater". This was a great activity for using skills such as communication, collaboration, problem solving, and creativity as well as Maths and Science skills. Our second activity was run by a 3rd year chemical engineering student where she outlined what is involved in designing chemical processes in terms of efficient and economical outcomes. We were then able to apply some of these ideas in making some essential oils, with varied success.

In the afternoon we heard from guest speakers about the possibilities and importance of engineering in solving problems and making a difference. A panel of female engineers answered questions and related their own journey in engineering. The key message was about the variety of jobs engineers do and how important they are in working on current problems and solutions for the future. It was emphasised that we need engineers from all different parts of society so that we can have a range of inputs. The students were encouraged to have courage to follow their passion and what gives them energy and make the most of their talent and opportunities.





# English Incursion

This term in English, our Year 7 students have been learning how to write newspaper reports and designing interesting newspaper pages to support this Josh Van Staden from Channel 7 News came to speak with the Year 7's English classes to share his knowledge on journalism.



## Australian Mathematics Competition

The Australian Mathematics Competition is a national competition for PP - Year 12 students. It aims to challenge and extend students' problem-solving skills in mathematics. The questions were incredibly challenging, with even the Maths teachers unsure of the final answers. Some outstanding results were achieved, with more than half the students completing a credit certificate or higher. We had several students achieve a Distinction, and one student achieved a High Distinction, placing them in the top 10% of their cohort. Geraldton Grammar School is partnering with the Mathematics Association of WA (MAWA) to run problem-solving workshops for interested students to continue developing these skills. We hope to have several students be chosen for a Maths Problem Solving extension program to be run next year.

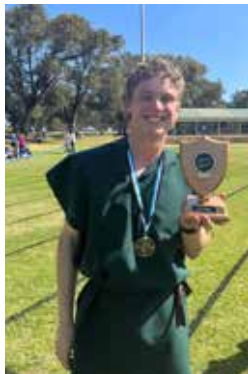


# Secondary Athletics Carnival

### **Finn Preston - Talented Soccer Player**



In the second week of the school holidays, Finn was a Football West Talent Support Program Under 15 team member and participated in the Malaysia Borneo Football Cup in Kota Kinabalu. This international tournament lasts over 5 days, with 2 games daily in high humidity and heat.

Finn's team consisted of players from all over the state (including Divine Verbe). Other participating teams were from the Singapore national U15, Australian Institute of Sport, and Malaysian national teams. The games were played in full stadiums of both grass and synthetic pitches. The team travelled with 2 coaches, a team physio and a manager. During some downtime, we were able to experience some of the amazing habitats in Borneo and got to see the local Proboscis Monkeys and Borneo Fireflies.

In November, he was invited to play with the Under 16 Goldfields Football West team to participate in SingaCup Asia's Premier International Youth Football Tournament. This was also a week-long event based in Singapore on synthetic turf pitches. Again, This team had players from all over the state and top-ranked country players. Finn was chosen as striker/wing for most of the tournament and finished as Centre-Mid and Captain of the team.

Both events were a huge opportunity to showcase skills, fitness, and resilience internationally. Finn enjoyed the challenge of playing in a high-level tournament and met other players from all over the world with whom he continues to be in contact. He learnt new strategies and game plays and enjoyed being coached by coaches with extremely high expectations of players .... he loved being pushed to the limit. With no bench time, he came home knowing he achieved what they wanted from a player. His state coach described him as 'the player every coach wants in his team' and hopes Finn will move to Perth!

In the general Geraldton season, Finn was youngest in the team and was runner up under 16 F&B for his club Chapman, Men's B grade runner up F&B, and the Golden Boot award for highest scorer for club and association.

To cap things off for Finn this year, he was a Finalist in the Midwest Junior Sports Award for 2023.
