The theme for this year was "Take A Walk in My Shoes" and focused on building a deeper understanding of the concept of empathy through Habit 5 "Seek First to Understand", The Act, Belong, Commit philosophy was another strong theme highlighted throughout the day.

The day of fun, friendship and learning began with an assembly hosted by 3/4LK. A major highlight of the assembly was the annual Big Ball Game which, judging from the excitement, was greatly enjoyed by the children. Following the assembly, students returned to their classrooms to participate in a Wellbeing Walk where they took time to put themselves in a buddy's shoes as they walked and talked around the oval, responding to various discussion prompts. Back in their classrooms the children created customised shoes to share with others. The shoes provide the opportunity for all students to develop their empathy skills as they discovered more about their class members.

The day concluded with a special House buddy session, where the children created Act, Belong, Commit Chatter Boxes and discussed happy healthy mental wellbeing tips.

Following on from the awareness raising day, The INSPIRE Student Leadership Team facilitated a Happy Hopscotch Pay It Forward activity for each House to participate in during lunch time. Many children participated in the activity, displaying a willingness to act, belong and commit to enhancing their own and other's mental wellbeing. Early Steps Science

The P-2 students were lucky enough to visit the Secondary Science department to learn about Chemical Science. Ms Bruce, Mr Da Silva, Ms Beeck and some Year 8 volunteers discussed and demonstrated the properties of dry ice. We observed what happens when dry ice blows up a balloon and a large bubble made with washing liquid. Thank you very much to the wonderful Science teachers for the demonstrations and allowing the Early Steps students to utilise the secondary resources and classroom.















Year 1/2 students have been experimenting with materials. We have looked at the different types of materials and their properties, and how they can be combined and changed for a purpose. In class we combined materials to make playdough. Throughout our investigations we have combined different materials to make Christmas come to life!













The 4 Year Old Kindy class has been investigating OPTICS this term through the Little Scientists program. This program gives young children the opportunity to explore STEM ideas and the natural world in a nurturing and playful way. The students have been using their senses to discover the magic of colour, mirrors and shadows. They have all had lots of fun exploring different light sources, playing with torches, investigating fluorescent paint under UV light, experimenting with mirror reflections, creating sun catchers and discovering shadows.

On Thursday 15 September, the Pre Primary and Year 1 students walked to Midalia Park to study Natural, Managed and Constructed features of our environment. The students participated in a variety of activities including a nature walk, working with Book Creator to take photos of natural, managed and constructed features and identifying how we can look after the park. At the Ern Clark Athletics Centre in Cannington in October the All Schools Athletics Championships were held and three of our Secondary students competed - Christi Bestry, Ella Batten and Sophie Batten.

Christi is the new Girls 15yrs 3000m All Schools State Champion. This is the first time she has won a Gold medal in this event and did it with a PB time of 10:22mins. She also defended her Girls 15yrs 2000m Steeplechase State Title with a fantastic win in 7:30mins.

Ella achieved a great Silver medal in Girls 16yrs High Jump, jumping 1.60m (5cm off the winning jump) and a Bronze medal in the Girls 16yrs 100m Hurdles.

Both girls are now heading to Adelaide for the Australian All Schools Athletics Championships on 9th - 11th December to represent WA in the State Team.

Sophie participated in her last All Schools Championships, being the only competitor tough enough to participate in the Girls 18yrs 400m hurdles, taking home the Gold in 72:21, and one of 2 competitors in the Girls 18yrs 100m hurdles to take the Silver medal.


Aidan Peacey - Passport 2 Employment
